SUPPORT

SB 243

Prohibit physicians from performing gender reassignment surgery on minors.

HB 3616

The "Defense of Children's Innocence Act" classifies any business where drag shows are held as a sexually oriented business, prohibits minors from attending.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 276

To provide that a person's biological sex at birth constitutes that person's gender for the purposes of the state constitution and laws.

SB 623

Prohibits non-binary "X" markers on birth certificates and make birth certificates harder to change.

SB 624

Defines an individual's gender as their sex assigned at birth for all state purposes, such as laws and the state constitution.

SB 627

Prohibit gender transition procedures to a person under eighteen years of age.

THE FACTS DID YOU KNOW?

According to the NIH, adolescence is an important time for brain development.

The brain finishes developing and maturing in the midto-late 20s. The part of the brain behind the forehead, called the prefrontal cortex, is one of the last parts to mature. This area is responsible for skills like planning, prioritizing, and making good decisions.

According to the CDC, child sexual abuse refers to the involvement of a child (person less than 18 years old) in sexual activity that violates the laws or social taboos of society and that he/she:

- · does not fully comprehend
- does not consent to or is unable to give informed consent to, or
- is not developmentally prepared for and cannot give consent to

According to the CDC, the parents are responsible for ensuring that children have safe, stable, nurturing relationships and environments.
