**LEGISLATURE BILL 574 -
APPROVED BY GOVERNOR**

Prohibits health care providers from administering to patients younger than 19 medical interventions such as puberty blockers, hormone treatments and genital or non-genital surgeries.

LEGISLATURE BILL 371

Prohibit an individual under nineteen years of age or under twenty-one years of age from being present at a drag show.

DID YOU KNOW?

According to the CDC, child sexual abuse refers to the involvement of a child (person less than 18 years old) in sexual activity that violates the laws or social taboos of society and that he/she:

- does not fully comprehend
- does not consent to or is unable to give informed consent to, or
- is not developmentally prepared for and cannot give consent to

According to the CDC, the parents are responsible for ensuring that children have safe, stable, nurturing relationships and environments.
